This datasheet shows how to take content from an existing InDesign file and migrate it to the Workiva platform together with the styles.

If you want to get content and styles into the Workiva platform follow the steps below. Make sure all styles are applied in each process. After the first ICML has been imported into InDesign and style attributes changed, these changes will persist after subsequent ICML pulls.

Import Word file into the Workiva platform

Workiva Platform

Content and styles are now in the Workiva platform. Check all styles are applied and export via ICML



Delete the old text in InDesign and then place the ICML. Join text frames if necessary

InDesign Plug-in

The Workiva Integration Plug-in (InDesign Plug-in) is a tool that can be used to help InDesign users prepare to bring back content back into Workiva. When bringing content back into Workiva, it will be converted from IDML to XHTML. Full details <u>here</u>.

Production Cheat Sheet IDML>XHTML

This cheat sheet assumes that below is already done:

- All bitmap images are .png, .jpg, .gif, are 72 or 144 dpi, RGB, and are cropped to the containing frame.
- All vector graphics are SVG format and exported from Illustrator with outlines and use RGB colours.
- All assets are to be embedded in the InDesign document.
- Make sure all styles are web compliant and not contained in folders.
- Make sure you only use one level of master page. Multiple master pages can be used but must be styled in a compliant way.
- Make sure all colour swatches are RBG.
- Do not rename fonts from their original.
- Make sure your client has the web usage rights to any fonts they are using. If they are using fonts in the Workiva platform, they are covered.
- If you are using grep styles, make sure the regular expressions are applied via the find and replace function before you do your conversion. This will depend on what the grep styles are trying to do.

Step 1:

Make copy of document. This is a disruptive process.

Step 2: Unlink all ICMLs.

Step 3:

Split all linked text frames with either the Split story script built into InDesign or the feature on the integration tool.

Step 4:

If you haven't created a package, do so now. You only need the IDML and the fonts. This will become your master export folder.

Step 5:

If you are using fonts not on the Wdesk platform, you will now need to package your IDML and your font package into a single zip file.

Step 6:

Upload this zip file using the Create button in Wdesk to convert IDML to XHTML.

NB: You only have to create the package once as subsequent IDMLs can be saved to that folder.

Please try to make sure you validate your document using the InDesign Integration tool.

Production Cheat Sheet

Tables

- Due to the limitations of ICML, table width and height cannot be changed in InDesign. Therefore, make sure these are set correctly in the Workiva platform.
- Margins and gutters should be the same in Workiva and InDesign before you start document setup.
- Workiva exports one table style.
- The design of content within table cells is controlled by Paragraph, Character and Cell styles
- Workiva does not have cell styles. Cell styles are created based on the look and feel in Workiva and exported via ICML.
- To style a table uniquely, isolate the table in the Workiva platform and add something unique like a light tint background. This will create a unique set of editable cell styles in InDesign.
- Ignore coloured brackets these do not hinder design. These are placeholders for the XBRL tags.
- Row heights of tables can differ between InDesign and XHTML. Please use the NoRule style to control the padding top and bottom of all cells globally and adjust individual cell styles to be more specific.

Graphs

- All Workiva graphs will be exported via ICML. They will be named the same as the section name where they exist in Workiva followed by .svg.
- Export the ICML section containing the graph.
- Place the SVG into InDesign like you would place an image.
- Designers can add extra lines or shapes on top of the linked graph to enhance look and feel if desired.
- Chart content cannot be changed in InDesign. Changes must be made in Workiva.
